For students with multiple records of graduate or professional enrollment in NSC's database, the earliest record was utilized.

<sup>\*\*\*</sup>Of the 3,698 students included in the student cohort, only 61.90% (n = 2,289) appeared in NSC's database. Of those, only 43.38% (n = 993) have at least one record of graduate or professional enrollment following their graduation from the University.
