COURSE STATEMENT

In this course, we will examine the ethical and legal challenges that are faced within clinical practice. The student will explore many different elements involved in managing legal and ethical standards. In addition, the student will gain an overall understanding about the purpose and practice of ethical standards in order to decrease future risk within clinical practice.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is intended for professionals working in the mental health care field (therapists, social workers, psychologist) in addition to individuals working in public health, education, and criminal justice. The Law and Ethics course will review the ethical and legal matters that clinicians face on a daily basis. Specifically, the course will meet the 6-hour CEU Ethics requirement for individuals that are renewing their license in the state of California with the Board of Behavioral Sciences. This course also satisfies the California BBS Law and Ethics training requirements under (1887.3) for LMFT, LPCC, LCSW, and Educational Psychologists, in addition to the BOP requirements for Psychologists.
