Completion of the full CSU or UC IGETC certification (CA), Washington and Oregon state-approved Direct Transfer degrees or other state's equivalent transfer certification prior to the student being admitted, enrolled and attending his/her first session in a bachelor degree program at Brandman satisfies all Brandman University GE requirements except LBSU 300. Students who matriculate to Brandman with partial GE certifications will have their coursework evaluated on a course by course basis to determine appropriate applicability to each general education category.

Lower division courses from Norco College are not considered equivalent and therefore do not receive upper division credit. Certain lower division courses may be eligible to fulfill these upper division requirements if approved by the Dean of the School of Arts and Sciences.
