The Curriculum Alignment Eight (CAP 8) may be transferred in from a community college. Any CAP 8 approved courses must have been taken after the date that the institution was aligned through the Child Development Training Consortium. An associate degree in Child Development or Early Childhood Education earned at a regionally accredited institution, a valid Child Development Permit at the Teacher level or higher, or a State ECE Certificate may be used to fulfill the CAP 8 requirement.

Degree Requirements & Concentrations/Electives

BA Early Childhood Education consists of a 51 credit requirement for the program.
