## **Degree Requirements & Concentrations/Electives**

BA Psychology program consists of 33 credits in core courses and 15 credits in courses in a selected area of emphasis to fulfill the 48 credit requirement for the program.

Students may choose from the following emphases:

- 1. Industrial/Organizational
- 2. Child Psychology
- 3. General Psychology
- 4. Preparation for Advanced Study in Counseling
- 5. Preparation for Advanced Study in Psychology

It is possible for transfer courses to meet course requirements within the emphasis area. That coursework must be reviewed by a dean within the School of Arts and Sciences to determine transferability.

\*Minimum of 30 credits completed in residence at University of Massachusetts Global; 18 of which must be upper-division credits, 12 of which must be in the student's major.
