Degree Requirements & Concentrations

AAC Competency Based General Business program consists of 15 General Education competencies, 4 Business Core competencies and 9 equivalent credits of electives .

Students may choose from the following emphases:

1. General Business

While it is possible for transfer coursework to meet competency requirements within these emphasis areas, that coursework must be reviewed by an academic dean within the School of Business and Professional Studies to determine transferability.
