Degree Requirements & Concentrations/Electives

BS in Nursing consists of 68 credits of ASN/AND Block Transfer, 16 credits in foundation courses and 36 credits of Nursing Core Courses to fulfill the 120 credit requirement.

It is possible for transfer courses to meet course requirements within the emphasis area. That coursework must be reviewed by a Dean within the Marybelle and S. Paul Musco School of Nursing and Health Professions to determine transferability.
