Degree Requirements & Concentrations/Electives

BA Psychology program consists of 33 credits in core courses and 15 credits in courses in a selected area of emphasis to fulfill the 48 credit requirement for the program.

Students may choose from the following emphases:

1. Industrial/Organizational
2. Child Psychology
3. General Psychology
4. Preparation for Advanced Study in Counseling
5. Preparation for Advanced Study in Psychology

It is possible for transfer courses to meet course requirements within the emphasis area. That coursework must be reviewed by a dean within the School of Arts and Sciences to determine transferability.
