The following information is a guide of courses that transfer to UMass Global to fulfill requirements in the Associates of Arts in General Business Competency-Based program.

The Associate of Arts in General Business Competency-Based program includes Foundation Knowledge and Skills, Business Core and General Business Emphasis. See the catalog for a full list along with information on transferring prior coursework to meet UMass Global competencies.

Course articulation information is provided for all California and out-of-state community colleges, as well as many four year institutions across the country. These represent course work which UMass Global will accept in transfer to meet course equivalencies, general education, or general elective credit. The information has been developed without assistance from the institutions included in this database, however in most instances it is shared with these institutions for accuracy. The information provided is developed to assist students and advisors in determining how transfer credit may apply to UMass Global. Courses not listed in the database have not yet been reviewed for transfer and in some cases may be appropriate for transfer credit.

This list includes only the requirements that are commonly seen in transfer at a lower-division level and is not a comprehensive list of all the course requirements within the Associate of Arts in General Business Competency Based program. However, your official admission evaluation will be based on all transfer coursework received at the lower division and upper division level.
